2019 "WALK WITH DEE" MY STORY

In August 2014 I was diagnosed with stage 3 breast cancer. After surgery, chemotherapy, and radiation, "I'M STILL STANDING!" I am celebrating 5 years out this month, thanks to the care I received from Sunnybrook's doctors and clinical staff. One of the after-effects of the treatment is lymphedema.

Some people are born with lymphedema; while others develop it after their lymphatic system has been damaged by trauma, injury, burns, or most commonly, treatment for some cancers. There is no cure for lymphedema at this time. It is a lifelong condition. When diagnosed and treated early, however, you can manage it and prevent

it from leading to more serious health problems. Knowledge is the key to lymphedema prevention, early detection, diagnosis, and treatment. It helps to lessen our fears and move us to action. Here are the ways in which I have been giving back:

- Volunteer at Sunnybrook Patient Family Advisory Committee (PFAC) since 2015
- Volunteer at Wellspring Cancer Care Centre since 2016
- CIBC Walk for the Cure, 2015 & 2016
- Walk with Dee 2017 & 2018 to raise funds for Wellspring
- Volunteer Board Director of the Lymphedema Association of Ontario, 2019 since April 2019 and on August 27th accepted the position of President.

I will be donating the funds from the 2019 Walk with Dee to the Lymphedema Association of Ontario's Compassionate Fund, so that deserving patients can receive assessment, some treatment and self-care tips. My goal of \$2500 was exceeded. Total raised so far... \$3000!

ELLICSR COOKING CLASS

As reported at our AGM, the LAO participated in the monthly Cooking and Nutrition Class on August 15 at the ELLICSR facility at Toronto General Hospital. We are a Community Partner of ELLICSR which has an impressive facility providing support and education for cancer patients including a meeting room, educational resources, a gym and a monthly cooking class in a well-furnished kitchen. Approximately 35 attended this class in person, including patients and health care staff. It was also live streamed on You Tube to a wider audience. The “LAO Chef”, adorned in a colourful apron drawing ‘comments’ from audience members, and relying entirely on the leadership of an expert wellness Chef and Registered Dietician, participated in preparing three delicious dishes designed to benefit lymphedema sufferers or at risk persons indirectly: Sweet and Sour Zucchini Flat Bread; Roasted Arctic Char with Fennel and Orange; and Summer Berries with Sesame Brittle and Yogurt! The results were successful and shared with attendees who seemed to enjoy these tasty dishes. The class was an enjoyable and fulfilling experience and gave the “LAO Chef” an opportunity to talk about lymphedema and describe the LAO and what are objectives are. Thank you to everyone who joined us during our Annual General Meeting (AGM) on September 17th, 2019. We covered a lot during our tele/video conference and we are thrilled with the number of members who were able to join. For those of you who were not able to attend, we are pleased to provide you with a recap of the items that were covered:

- Formally acknowledge the contribution of former Board Directors: Pouya Arefi former President, Ben Ciallella, former Treasurer, Liisa Morley, Former Vice President and Communications Lead and Debbie-Ciotti-Bowman, former Advocacy lead and former President. We thank them for their service and wish them well in their new endeavours.
- Unanimous approval of the 2018 AGM minutes.
- A formal introduction of the current LAO Board of Directors: Dolores Steinwall, President, Ana Stosic, Events & Communications lead, Tony Wight, Secretary and Awareness lead, Charlotte Schultz, Advocacy lead, Rob Caparelli, Treasurer and Jaclyn Jones, Director.
 - Dolores Steinwall, Charlotte Schultz, Rob Caparelli and Jaclyn Jones were all nominated and unanimously elected. Their terms began during the 2018/2019 fiscal year.
- Treasurer’s report included a review of the comparative balance sheet, statement of operations, changes in fund balances, and statement of cash flows.
- Appointment of Melissa L. Coulson, C.A., as the Chartered Professional Accountant for the LAO.
- Review of Events and ongoing Member and public outreach and communications initiatives including participation in the Scotiabank Toronto Waterfront Marathon which raised \$7,615.00 through generous sponsorship, donations and fundraising. The 3rd Annual LaSalle/Windsor Walk was also highlighted—special thanks to Maddie Simone and Diane Leider for their role in organizing this fundraising event.

- Presentation of community awareness activities including Breast Reconstruction Day, official proclamation of Lymphedema Awareness Day in the City of Toronto (March 6th), Information booth at Princess Margaret Hospital and Guelph General Hospital, Juravinski Cancer Centre and Cooking and Nutrition Class at the ELLICSR Facility in Toronto.
- On the Advocacy front, a review of the Legislative luncheon reception with the Canadian Cancer Survivorship Network at Queen’s Park.
- Major fundraising initiative and a generous donation from the proceeds of the 2019 Hellenic Gold Plate Dinner in Ottawa.
- Looking ahead to the remainder of 2019 and toward 2020, the LAO endeavours to:
 - Activate Compassionate fund when funds are available
 - Research and create an LAO Advisory Board
 - Create awareness communication document, “6 Things your Doctor should know”
